#### Dear valued members of the Carbal Medical Centre Community,

Last week we hosted the **Annual General Meeting** of Darling Downs Shared Care Inc. trading as Carbal Medical Services. The Chair and financial reports were both well received and adopted unanimously.

The report highlighted that our revenue for the period increased significantly which was excellent and there is further growth projected in the current financial year budget. This growth is largely due to the savings made through streamlining the organisation and partly due to the additional program funding that we have been able to attract which in itself reflects a sound level of confidence in Carbal by the funding bodies.

It is most pleasing to report that one third of our income is now self-generated and that much of this income is now being used to 'value-add' to the various programs that we are funded to deliver.

We have also funded a number of programs and activities that do not receive funding but that have been identified by Carbal as 'gaps' in the provision of health services to Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islanders within our service region.

The Board of Management is extremely pleased that we are able to expand our services within our charter due to the growth in our income and the professional management of our resources and I would like to congratulate each of the members who hold these voluntary positions for their strategic vision, enormous support and commitment throughout the year.

On Saturday 10th October, the Board met to finalise the draft proposal, constitution and recommendations related to the changes required to migrate from an Association to a Company by June 30, 2016.

Given the enormous growth that has occurred at Carbal, particularly over the past couple of years, the status of Company will provide far greater support and protections to all involved with the provision of funding and the delivery of our services. The draft constitution was distributed and discussed at the AGM and the members present voted unanimously to adopt a proposed motion to proceed to the next stage. Current members will all have opportunity for comment and input prior to any final position being formalised next year and I encourage your input. The draft has now been distributed to all members. Written feedback should be directed to bhewitt@carbal.com.au and submissions will be accepted up until Monday 29th February 2016. The Board will then meet to discuss and finalise the constitution for adoption by the members. I encourage all members to play an active part in the determination of the rules that will govern Carbal as we progress to the next important step in our development.

As this is the final newsletter for 2015, on behalf of the members of the Board, the staff of Carbal and myself I would like to wish all of our valued clients a very happy and peaceful Christmas and a wonderfully exciting New Year!

Hi I'm Belinda Ott, I'm a proud Aboriginal woman from Yimen country, which is just south of Canarvan Gorge here in Queensland.

My Grandfather was Ted Waddy and he was taken to several of the missions throughout his life... that being Cherbourg, Warrabinda and Purga near Ipswich.

My Mother is Kathleen Waddy who was born in Tara and lived around the fringes of Kingaroy and Memerambi.

I was born in Ipswich where I spent most of my childhood and then we moved to Dalby where I spent my teenage and young adulthood there.

I moved to Toowoomba and started employment at a school here and then moved to Townsville, where I completed a Diploma in Aboriginal health and Community development through University of Sydney.

I continued to study and live in Townsville for a number of years but in 2013 I moved out to Alice Springs where I gained my Cert IV in Aboriginal health in Practice and registration through AHPRA.... In 2014 I studied a post Grad Dip in Aboriginal Health Promotion which was great!

At the end of 2014 I moved from Townsville back to Ipswich to be close to my family. I then moved up to Toowoomba in July... mind you the coldest weekend of the year...lol.... and started working for Carbal... which I thoroughly enjoy the staff here are great... very warm and easy to work with! I hope to stay here for a while yet... as I have my brothers family and sisters family also living in Toowoomba.




#### **MERCY CHRISTMAS CAROLS**

Above it is another goanna that has found its way free. This shows us that we have a choice about whether to stay stuck or not. As the goanna finds a way under the serpent or over the serpent, we can find a way too to be free from pain and to heal.

I have suffered anxiety and depression for most of my adult life. My depression became so overwhelming and thoughts of suicide were beginning to take control of me. This became my turning point to seek support and to find my path to recovery.

My art is an expression of how it is possible to free yourself from the pain, silence and isolation of mental illness. I believe that it's never too late to begin the healing process and to take back your birth right of a journey that is of peace, joy and fulfilment. The events and circumstances and challenges in our lives are sometimes difficult and painful to overcome.

My painting 'Broken Spirit' tells us that the intrusion of mental illness can be beaten and we can again take back our power and break the cycle to continue our divine journey with love, peace and honour on our earth.

The new Women's Wellness shirts were launched and 85 shirts were handed out on the day to women who presented for a full health check.

We had representatives from True (formally Family Planning QLD), Breast Screen QLD, TAFE QLD, Centrecare and the Women's Continence Clinic at the Base Hospital. They provided information on all of their services and were available throughout the day to answer any queries.

Breast Screen also booked 22 appointments into the breast screen clinic at the hospital. We had activities for children, hamper draws every hour and a free BBQ was available all day. We were very excited to see so many of our clients attend the day and the staff were overwhelmed with the response.

It was a great opportunity to offer another service through the clinic to add to the many programs that we already provide.

The wellness checks will now be available for bookings with any of our GPs and the shirts will also be available to all women who complete the wellness check, have had a pap smear and a breast check, or breast screen for those clients who are over 40. **Please give the clinic a call to make a booking**.
